From 2016 to present:

Active Retirement. I remain busy with volunteer work and presentation/trainings on the topics of cultural awareness and historical trauma as relevant to Native American issues. From August 2013 to 2016:

Self-employed as sole proprietor of EchoHawk Counseling (EHC). I returned to private practice to pursue personal interests in my counseling career to: work with men in a private practice addressing trauma, grief and loss, to also offer counseling and supervision services to agencies as an independent contractor, and to provide presentations and trainings for agencies regarding cultural awareness, especially as it relates to Native Americans and Historical Trauma related issues.

From July 2012 to August 2013:

Clinical Supervisor, Chemical Dependency Program, Community Services Northwest (CSN) in Vancouver, WA. I provided clinical supervision to a staff of dual diagnosis (COD) counselors, CD Youth and Adult chemical dependency counselors in an outpatient and intensive outpatient setting.

From May 2005 to July 2012:

Self-employed as sole proprietor of EchoHawk Counseling (EHC). I provided supervisory support to peer counselors and pursued my own personal volunteerism including an advisory role at CPS in Vancouver for cases involving Native American children (ICWA related cases).

From September 1999 to May 2005:

I was employed as a **dual-diagnosis counselor** at Community Services Northwest (CSN) in Vancouver Washington. I was a lead counselor on the intensive outpatient (IOP) dual-diagnosis team.

From March 1999 to May 1999:

I worked as an **inpatient dual diagnosis counselor** at Native American Rehab Association (NARA) in Portland Oregon in their inpatient program.

From September 1996 to August 1998:

I worked as an **outpatient chemical dependency counselor** in Denver, Colorado at Arapahoe House.

From October 1997 to June 1998:

I also worked concurrently as an **inpatient counselor** at Eagle Lodge in Denver, Colorado, an agency that served Native Americans from the area and from around the country.

From 1994 through 1996:

I was a **graduate student** at Denver Seminary (CACREP accredited) in the Master's Community Mental Health

Prior to 1994:

I was an **electrical engineer** until 1993. Prior to engineering I was an **electronics tech**. Prior to my electronics experience I served as a dental tech in the **US Army during the Viet Nam era** and received an honorable discharge.
